Most of us have a tool of some kind that we rarely use. If you have something like that, it would make a great donation.


Spread the word about our fundraiser. The more people we have, the more successful we'll be in our fundraiser.

TIP: Cleaning Varnish Brushes

The standard procedure for cleaning a varnish brush is to rinse in mineral spirits and then wash with soap and water. The problem is the large number of times you have to wash to achieve a good lather, which indicates the bristles are clean.

You can speed the cleaning by rinsing the brush in lacquer thinner after two or three rinses in mineral spirits. The lacquer thinner removes the oiliness of the mineral spirits so the lather can be achieved after only one or two washings.

You can substitute acetone or brush cleaner for the lacquer thinner. In fact, you can do all the rinsings in lacquer thinner, acetone or brush cleaner, but these are more expensive than mineral spirits.



Workbench Corner Hook




I've found that a bench hook that mounts over the edge of the workbench is a great way to hold a workpiece in place. But the traditonal bench hook that I was using had one annoying fault. It wouldn't always stay put. A sudden tip or slide along the bench was a common occurence. So I came up with the new and improved "corner" hook that you see in photo at right.

A Clean Filter



A shop vacuum works a lot better if you clean the filter regularly. But from the lack of a quick and easy method, I tended to avoid this unpleasant chore. Finally I got motivated and came up with a way to make the job a little more palatable.



The drawing shows how this simple fixture is constructed. The advantage is pretty obvious. The two bottom cleats wrap around the corner of the bench for much better stability. Now I don't have to worry about an unexpected shift while making a critical cut on a workpiece.

My solution was to speed up the job of brushing the dust from the filter by spinning it on a cordless drill. To do this, you'll first need to make an arbor to hold the filter, as shown in the drawing. The arbor starts with a length of threaded rod that can be chucked into the drill. The filter is placed over the rod and sandwiched between a washer and nut on one end and a wood plug, washer and nut on the other.

The cleaning is best done outdoors. With the drill in one hand and a shop brush in the other, I spin the filter, holding the brush against it. The bristles work their way into the shallow pleats and rapidly dislodge most of the dust. The job is done quickly and my shop vacuum is back at peak performance.
